On January 20, 2024, the Tokyo Lycee Families Association (FLT) and the LFI Tokyo management successfully hosted a festive event celebrating the King Cake tradition. From 10 a.m. in the main building cafeteria, the event featured 43 cakes for over 180 participants, including children and adults, and a play and relaxation area for families.

Guests enjoyed traditional frangipane cakes and a "tropézienne" version from Au Merveilleux de Fred bakery, together with fruit juice and cider.

Dragons-themed - to mark the year - beans were followed by the gift of 3D-printed articulated dragons to the little kings and queens of the day.

The event also provided an opportunity for parents to meet FLT members and learn about the association through speeches by President Célia Hughes and Vice-President Virginie Cammas.

REPRESENTATION IN VARIOUS COUNCILS

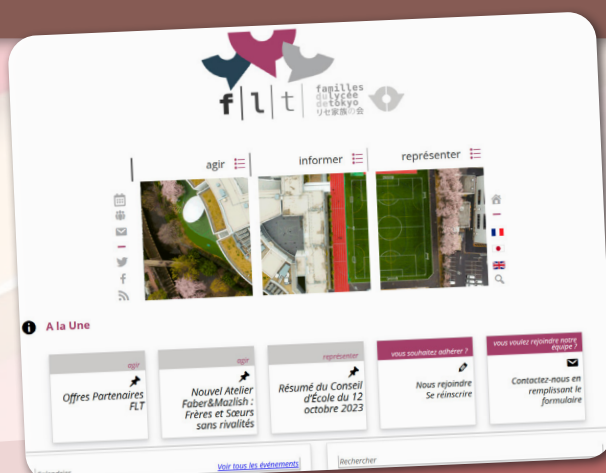
In this second installment, we represented you in various councils: the school council, the primary school council, and the council of the secondary. Topics discussed included:

SUMMARY OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SECONDARY ON JANUARY 17, 2024

This summary, written by parents, is not official. It covers the main topics discussed at the last council meeting, such as aligning the school calendar with Japanese holidays and AEFE guidelines, scheduling exams and mock exams, approving school trips in Japan and abroad for competition finals, and addressing various logistical and pedagogical issues, including access to online textbooks, creating an exam center for the GEIPI-Polytech engineering school entrance exam in Japan, and managing delays.

Regarding school trips, it is noteworthy that the Ambassadors in Grass and the Youth Olympiads took place thanks to generous sponsors who helped reduce travel costs for families below the 150,000 yen cap. The solidarity fund was also used to support about fifteen families for all the trips.

Unfortunately, the football tournament in Hanoi could not proceed due to its cost and lack of sponsors.

We thank the generous sponsors who particularly helped the Youth Olympiad team achieve first place among schools outside of France and third place overall. Congratulations!



PARENTAL SUPPORT IN CONFLICT RESOLUTION PROGRAM

The Parents' Association wishes to remind all members of our school community of its commitment to providing support and attentive listening to parents dealing with delicate situations, especially when one of their children is involved in a conflict with other students.

Our role is not to judge or assign blame in such circumstances but to support parents in their interactions with the school administration.





We act as a benevolent mediator, ready to facilitate dialogue and seek amicable solutions.

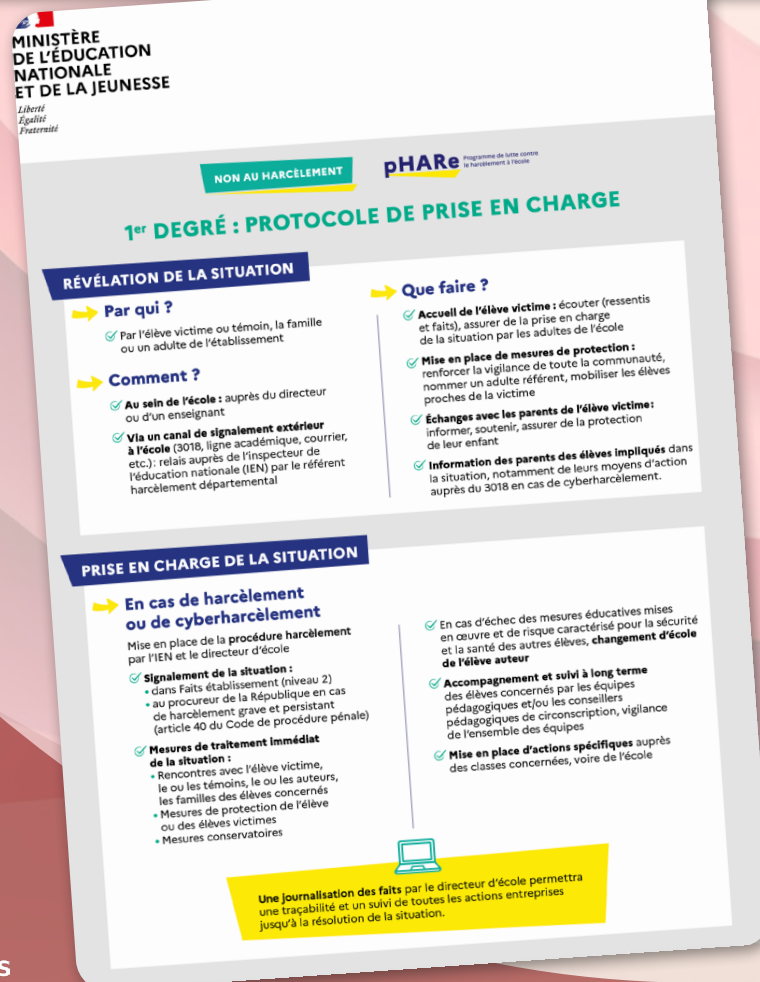
Whether it's preparing for a meeting with the administration or offering a space for listening and advice, we are here to assist you, respecting the interests of all parties involved.

Our goal is to help maintain a harmonious and safe school environment where every student can thrive safely.

Concerning the issue of school bullying program and French government decisions on this matter, the Parents' Association has participated in meetings to implement the pHARe program.

The pHARe program to combat bullying at school is a comprehensive plan for the prevention, handling and resolution of harassment situations. Introduced in 2021 and generalized to primary and secondary schools at the beginning of the 2022 school year, it has been extended to high schools since the start of the 2023 school year in mainland France.

Unfortunately, the implementation of this program takes more time for the overseas French schools of the AEFE network.





The pHARe program is built on 8 pillars:

- Gauge the school climate.
- Prevent instances of harassment.
- Form a protective community of professionals and staff around students.
- Intervene effectively in situations of harassment.
- Involve parents and partners and raise awareness on the program.
- Mobilize the school democratic bodies (CVC, CVL) and the committee on health, citizenship and environmental education.
- Monitor the impact of these actions.
- Provide a platform dedicated to resources.

PHARe is based on the mobilization of educational teams and students:

- a “resource team” (5 per secondary school, 5 per constituency in the first degree) is responsible for implementing the support protocol for harassment situations in each 1st degree constituency and in each 2nd degree establishment, in all academies. To this end, members of the team benefit from eight days of academic training over two years, dedicated to situations of harassment and cyberharassment and in particular acts of intimidation and their handling, identification and treatment;
- a “program team” organizes, in each school, secondary or high school, 10 hours of annual learning for all students from CP to Terminale, on the prevention of harassment and development of psychosocial skills;
- student ambassadors for the fight against bullying are trained in the 2nd degree. PHARe also provides for the participation of students in three key prevention periods during the school year and the organization of awareness workshops for families.

Given the training needs of the three aforementioned teams, the program will only be fully operational in the second half of the 2024/2025 school year, at best. We will keep you informed of any progress in this regard.

In the meantime, the administration and teaching staff will do their best to handle any cases that may arise, and we are here to support the families who need assistance.



“KANGOUROU DES MATHS” SUPPORT

This year, although the LFI Tokyo could not manage the organization of the Kangourou des Maths Competition, the parents' association took the initiative to manage the registrations.

Thanks to a targeted communication campaign, more than 180 secondary students gathered to participate in this edition. With the support and involvement of the math teachers, the contest took place in classrooms on March 21, 2024.

We extend our sincerest thanks to the teachers for making it possible for our children to participate in this educational and fun contest, which can also be a valuable asset for their *Parcoursup* application.

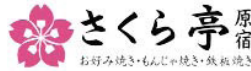
