Program**

A training session on the **pHARe program** (a program to combat bullying in schools) was held on October 17 at LFI Tokyo. This session brought together 19 participants representing the entire educational community: teachers from preschool to high school, the Principal Education Advisor (CPE), a library (CDI) staff member, two educational assistants, a nurse, and **a parent representative**.

**The pHARe program aims to create a caring school environment where every student can thrive safely. The success of this program relies on the commitment of the entire educational community, including parents.**

- Awareness workshops will be offered to you.

**In cases of bullying:**

- Regular follow-up meetings will be organized.
