Staying informed!

School calendar 2025-2026

During the various council meetings, the proposed school calendar for the 2025-2026 academic year was voted on. It still needs to be validated by the different AEFE authorities before becoming official, but unless there are changes:

- The 2025 back-to-school date should be Monday, September 1st.
- The autumn break is expected to be from October 18th to November 2nd (November 3rd is a public holiday in Japan but would be a school day at the Lycée).
- The Christmas holidays are planned from December 20th to January 4th.
- The winter break is scheduled from February 21st to March 8th.
- The spring break is set for April 25th to May 10th.
- The summer holidays would start on July 1st (with the last day of school on June 30th)
