Anti-Bullying Awareness



On **Friday, November 7**, we organized a private screening of Laura Wandel's film "Un monde" for parents as well as high school teachers. The film was also shown to all 8th grade and 10th grade classes.

This powerful film on bullying, told from a child's perspective, left a strong impression on the audience.

The screening also served to highlight the complexity of bullying, which is not limited to two actors—the bullied and the bully—but involves the entire surrounding environment, which may act as active or passive accomplices, intentionally or not. The film also clearly illustrated the consequences of such situations.

Mr. Jublot (CPE) and Ms. Campels (Principal) were present during the screening and emphasized the importance of reporting bullying or suspected bullying to teachers, school staff, nurses, or the school director.

This partnership is based on a simple and virtuous principle, benefiting the entire school community:

The collected books will be used to:
